from an article entitled history's black hole from the january 10 2016 global edition of the new york daily news arthur browne opines across every field of endeavor from the ministry to medicine and from education to entrepreneurship book merchants balk at memorializing black experience and accomplishments essentially this book is a celebration of black accomplishments over centuries and across continents and seeks to fill a portion of that black hole of the roughly 7 billion people who inhabit this planet some 1.5 billion are classified as white and blacks account for 1.1 billion the remaining over 4 billion are somewhere in the middle yet throughout the years a paucity of written materials have recorded the positive influences and myriad contributions that the great number of black citizens have made toward global peace progress prosperity and pleasure

our language is full of hundreds of quotations that are often cited but seldom confirmed ralph keyes's the quote verifier considers not only classic misquotes such as nice guys finish last and play it again sam but more surprising ones such as ain't i a woman and golf is a good walk spoiled as well as the origins of popular sayings such as the opera ain't over till the fat lady sings no one washes a rented car and make my day keyes's in depth research routinely confounds widespread assumptions about who said what where and when organized in easy to access dictionary form the quote verifier also contains special sections highlighting commonly misquoted people and genres such as yogi berra and oscar wilde famous last words and misremembered movie lines an invaluable resource for not just those with a professional need to quote accurately but anyone at all who is interested in the roots of words and phrases the quote verifier is not only a fascinating piece of literary sleuthing but also a great read

text and culture was first published in 1989 minnesota archive editions uses digital technology to make long unavailable books once again accessible and are published

unaltered from the original university of minnesota press editions in text culture daniel cottom examines the political aspects of contemporary disciplines of interpretation he pleads against limiting the act of reading by disqualifying some readings as wrong or unscholarly and he argues for the necessity of multiple readings claiming that a closed off text glosses over differences that are political in nature he proceeds then from the notion of text to culture just as the reading of the text is conditioned by irreducible political differences so is the reading of culture finally to illustrate and further develop his arguments cottom presents an extensive analysis of great expectations cottom s materials range from academic jokes to king lear and the writers he discusses range from kant to derrida from freud to basil bernstein from ludwig wittgenstein and bronislaw malinowski to erving goffman clifford geertz and stanley fish this study is especially concerned with the way culture and related terms such as context and norm are part of a larger discourse in the contemporary humanities and social sciences a discourse in which their effect is to repress recognition of important historical differences conflicts and possibilities at the same time that he shows how difficult it is to get beyond culture he tries to indicate how interpretation may be turned into a more socially responsible practice daniel cottom is associate professor of english at the university of florida he is the author of social figures george eliot social history and literary representation minnesota 1987 and the civilized imagination a study of ann radcliffe jane austen and sir walter scott

defiance of the law uses of indirection moral lapses and bad habits are as much a part of the folk transmitted biography of king as they are a part of writers depictions of him in literary texts harris first demonstrates that during the black arts movement of the 1960s when writers such as nikki giovanni sonia sanchez and leroi jones amiri baraka were rising stars in african american poetry king s philosophy of nonviolence was out of step with prevailing notions of militancy black power and their literature reflected that division in the quieter times of the 1970s and 1980s and into the twenty first century however treatments of king and his philosophy in african american literature changed writers who initially rejected him and nonviolence became ardent admirers and boosters particularly in the years following his assassination by the 1980s many writers skeptical about king had reevaluated him and began to address him as a fallen hero

a disproportionate number of male writers continue to be credited for constructing the iconic and ideological foundations for what would be perpetuated as the black art movement bam though an increasing amount of scholarship has recognised leading women artists activists and leaders of this period these new perspectives have yet to recognise adequately the ways women aspired to far more than a mere dismantling of male oriented ideals this book examines the work of several women artists working in chicago a key focal point for the energy and production of the movement

this book explores the democratization of music in our current era made possible by digital technologies music has become ubiquitous and increasingly intertwined with everyday life rendering previous models of creation performance and consumption obsolete diffusing music identifies trajectories between 20th century innovators and the broader redefinition of the musical art in popular culture today this approach can inform

new modalities of musical thinking in the wake of the transformations being actualized by artificial intelligence and other emerging technologies the author has been an active participant in many of the scenes and movements that gave rise to musical democratization his experiences and collaborations with influential figures in the field are woven into the fabric of the narrative

angela davis assata shakur a k a joanne chesimard and elaine brown are the only women activists of the black power movement who have published book length autobiographies in bearing witness to that era these militant newsmakers wrote in part to educate and to mobilize their anticipated readers in this way davis s *angela davis an autobiography* 1974 shakur s *assata* 1987 and brown s *a taste of power a black woman s story* 1992 can all be read as extensions of the writers political activism during the 1960s margo v perkins s critical analysis of their books is less a history of the movement or of women s involvement in it than an exploration of the politics of storytelling for activists who choose to write their lives perkins examines how activists use autobiography to connect their lives to those of other activists across historical periods to emphasize the link between the personal and the political and to construct an alternative history that challenges dominant or conventional ways of knowing the histories constructed by these three women call attention to the experiences of women in revolutionary struggle particularly to the ways their experiences have differed from men s the women s stories are told from different perspectives and provide different insights into a movement that has been much studied from the masculine perspective at times they fill in complement challenge or converse with the stories told by their male counterparts and in doing so hint at how the present and future can be made less catastrophic because of women s involvement the multiple complexities of the black power movement become evident in reading these women s narratives against each other as well as against the sometimes strikingly different accounts of their male counterparts as davis shakur and brown recount events in their lives they dispute mainstream assumptions about race class and gender and reveal how the black power struggle profoundly shaped their respective identities

this book examines key cases of terrorist violence to show that the invention of

terrorism was linked to the birth of modernity in europe russia and the united states rather than to tsarist despotism in 19th century russia or to islam sects in medieval persia combining a highly readable historical narrative with analysis of larger issues in social and political history the author argues that the dissemination of news about terrorist violence was at the core of a strategy that aimed for political impact on rulers as well as the general public dietze s lucid account also reveals how the spread of knowledge about terrorist acts was from the outset a transatlantic process two incidents form the book s centerpiece the first is the failed attempt to assassinate french emperor napolon iii by felice orsini in 1858 in an act intended to achieve italian unity and democracy the second case study offers a new reading of john brown s raid on the arsenal at harpers ferry in 1859 as a decisive moment in the abolitionist struggle and occurrences leading to the american civil war three further examples from germany russia and the us are scrutinized to trace the development of the tactic by first imitators with their acts of violence the invention of terrorism was completed terrorism has existed as a tactic since then and has essentially only been adapted through the use of new technologies and methods

shakespeare survey is a yearbook of shakespeare studies and production since 1948 survey has published the best international scholarship in english and many of its essays have become classics of shakespeare criticism each volume is devoted to a theme or play or group of plays each also contains a section of reviews of that year s textual and critical studies and of the year s major british performances the books are illustrated with a variety of shakespearean images and production photographs the virtues of accessible scholarship and a keen interest in performance from shakespeare s time to our own have characterised the journal from the start most volumes of survey have long been out of print backnumbers are gradually being reissued in paperback

what is african american about african american literature why identify it as a distinct tradition john ernest contends that too often scholars have relied on naive concepts of race superficial conceptions of african american history and the marginalization of important strains of black scholarship with this book he creates a new and just retelling of african american literary history that neither ignores nor transcends racial history ernest revisits the work of nineteenth century writers and activists such as henry box brown frederick douglass harriet wilson william wells brown and sojourner truth demonstrating that their concepts of justice were far more radical than those imagined by most white sympathizers he sheds light on the process of reading publishing studying and historicizing this work during the twentieth century looking ahead to the future of the field ernest offers new principles of justice that grant fragmented histories partial recoveries and still unprinted texts the same value as canonized works his proposal is both a historically informed critique of the field and an invigorating challenge to present and future scholars

passengers cancelling their tickets for titanic s maiden voyage out of apprehension a famous social reformer who died on titanic warned in 1911 that he would be in danger from water in april 1912 inhabitants of the remote islands of fiji aware of the sinking before reports of the collision reached the pacific a dying girl who on 14 april 1912 sees

a big ship sinking in the water and mysteriously knows the name of the violinist in titanic s orchestra these are just a few of the numerous claims to psychic foreknowledge of the ship s sinking within days of the widely publicised disaster of 1912 stories began circulating of extraordinary omens and individuals who supposedly had supernatural premonitions of the disaster furthermore four fictional works one dating as far back as twenty six years came to be seen as anticipating the disaster between 1960 and 2006 five major commentators published extended analyses of the alleged premonitions none of which is now easily accessible to an english readership this book examines them all in detail the whole treatment of the matter opens up fascinating questions concerning the paranormal but also raises and leaves unresolved crucial issues specific to premonitions and how they can be legitimately examined readers are left to make their own judgement on titanic premonitions

is heroism possible for everyone should it be what kinds of stories do we tell when we

talk about heroes and what do these stories reveal about how we view ourselves this book takes up these questions and more by reflecting on twenty first century american television shows among the shows examined are only murders in the building game of thrones the good lord bird the boys and severance what we find is an entertainment landscape unsure about what a hero is or even what qualifies as heroic in a nation uncertain about heroism we see a dramatic rise in the popularity of the anti hero and even in worlds without heroes this fragmented variety highlights how the american political mind is similarly fragmented in what it believes are its highest aspirations and its deepest anxieties it is this fragmentation that may help us understand why twenty first century entertainment has elevated the heroic to the supernatural while simultaneously democratizing heroism to the point where anyone may become one a hero in all of us heroism and american political thought as seen on tv explores this multifaceted landscape to better understand how americans view their heroes and themselves
