two remarkable iranian world maps were discovered in 1989 and 1995 both are made of brass and date from 17th century iran mecca is at the centre and a highly sophisticated longitude and latitude grid enables the user to determine the direction and distance to mecca for anywhere in the world between andalusia and china prior to the discovery of these maps it was thought that such cartographic grids were conceived in europe ca 1910 this richly illustrated book presents an overview of the ways in which muslims over the centuries have determined the sacred direction towards mecca qibla and then describes the two world maps in detail the author shows that the geographical data derives from a 15th century central asian source and that the mathematics underlying the grid was developed in 9th century baghdad

to its downfall in the early 20th century it features fourteen original papers by some of the most prominent and innovative scholars of ottoman history the book sheds light on the complex role that ideas have played in all aspects of ottoman social and political life throughout the history of the ottoman world across time space social class and ethnic and religious identity histories of political thought in the ottoman world takes exception to a common tendency both among ottoman historians and in the broader academic world that considers ottoman political life exclusively in terms of the political ideas of the sunni muslim governing elite it makes clear that the non elite non sunni muslim non muslim non turkish and female members of the ottoman society have also significantly contributed to the making of ottoman political culture throughout its history

this is the first systematic scholarly study of the ottoman experience of plague during the black death pandemic and the centuries that followed using a wealth of archival and narrative sources including medical treatises hagiographies and travellers accounts as well as recent scientific research nükhet varlik demonstrates how plague interacted with the environmental social and political structures of the ottoman empire from the late medieval through the early modern era the book argues that the empire s growth transformed the epidemiological patterns of plague by bringing diverse ecological zones into interaction and by intensifying the mobilities of exchange among both human and non human agents varlik maintains that persistent plagues elicited new forms of cultural imagination and expression as well as a new body of knowledge about the disease in turn this new consciousness sharpened the ottoman administrative response to the plague while contributing to the makings of an early modern state

framework for the perhaps overly broad concept of world trade entry topics were selected on trade organizations influential people commodities events that affected trade routes navigation religion communic

in the kazakh case the historical contradiction between the state policies and nomadic society resulted in massive population loss of nomadic kazakhs in 1930s the nomadic economy and social order were destroyed although nomadic kazakhs showed great resistance to the collectivization process much more than other periods their resistance eventually failed in this failure both the military power of the soviet state and the 19th century destruction of the kazakh zhuzes and the asabiyyah based on nomadism played a major role therefore the regional and fragmented struggle of the kazakhs did not turn into a mass resistance this case which was the last widespread war between the nomadic and settled world in recent history resulted in the destruction of the whole nomadic life of the asian half man half horse in kazakhstan
