the lord is the spirit 2 cor 3 17 and yet one might be excused for thinking otherwise when reading studies on god's attributes omnipotence omniscience omnipresence immutability impassibility and the like although christians throughout the ages have defended the deity of the holy spirit theologians have not adequately taken the doctrine of the holy spirit into account when formulating a theology of the divine attributes the resulting understandings of god fall short of being fully trinitarian gabriel builds on contemporary trinitarian theology by advocating for the integration of insights from pneumatology into the doctrine of god's attributes three case studies are presented impassibility immutability and omnipotence gabriel writes from an evangelical and pentecostal vantage point as he engages in ecumenical dialogue with a wide spectrum of historical and contemporary theological voices

too often skeptics charge christians with having a blind faith unfortunately believers have added fuel to the charges of skeptics by speaking of their faith illogically but the christian faith is not a blind faith in fact biblical faith is never a blind irrational faith christianity rests firmly on the stone that was rejected by the builders which has become the cornerstone jesus christ acts 4 11 living biblically requires thinking biblically just as to think biblically entails to live biblically as winfried corduan notes in the foreword as followers of christ believers cannot separate biblical thinking and biblical living these two behaviors are eternally connected not only in the person of jesus christ but they stem from the eternal being of god the father and his eternal truth christ mandates that his followers love god with their entire being heart soul mind and strength mark 12 30 how are believers to go about living out this biblical mandate christian faith is a warranted belief this is why it is so essential that christians recognize the value and importance of philosophy and its proper place in christendom and in the christian's walk

christianity is a way of life centered on the person life teaching death and resurrection of jesus the christ as a religious way of life christianity is multifaceted involving numerous beliefs and practices this book explores many of the varied facets of the christian faith including its foundations in the story of

anyone can be saved articulates a biblical theological explanation of the doctrine of salvation in light of the rise of calvinistic theology among southern baptist churches in the united states ten scholars pastors and leaders advocate for the ten articles of the traditional statement by appealing to scripture the baptist faith and message and a variety of biblical theological and philosophical writings although many books address the doctrine of salvation these authors consciously set aside the calvinist arminian presuppositions that have framed this discussion in western theology for centuries the contributors are unified in their conviction that any person who hears the gospel can be saved a view that was found among earlier baptists as well as other christian groups today this book is not meant to be the final word on southern baptist soteriology but is offered as a peaceable contribution to the wider conversation on the doctrine of salvation

there is a growing focus on the christian confession of god s completed kingdom the new heaven and the new earth this theme has time and again seduced people into elaborate fantasies that stimulated the senses how can we talk about it meaningfully raymond r hausoul relates systematic theology to biblical theology by comparing three theologians the catholic theologian karl rahner the protestant jürgen moltmann and the reformed gregory beale this leads to reflections on differences between matter space and time of the new heaven and new earth and those of our present reality the hope for renewal and resurrection

is thus linked to the prophecies of the new jerusalem the tree of life and the resurrection body

does god actually do anything in baptism is it more than just a symbol most early baptists would have answered yes most baptists today would answer no how and why did this change happen and does it matter providing thorough documentation of the changing understandings of baptism among american canadian and english baptists from the 1600s to the present day the secularization of baptism demonstrates that four factors led to the symbolic only position becoming dominant these were suspicion in reaction to roman catholicism of the idea of god revealing himself through the physical the influence of the enlightenment and embarrassment with claims that god could be acting in the world today reaction against the oxford movement and reaction against the understanding of baptism advocated by the disciples of christ campbellites the now dominant symbolic only position so focuses attention on what the believer is doing in baptism that god is seen as largely absent from and doing nothing through the rite in effect believers baptism has been secularized a carefully reasoned biblical and theological argument is made for a return to the regular particular baptist view that god is both profoundly spiritually present and active in baptism while at the same time rejecting the sacramentalist position advocated by a small number of mid twentieth and twenty first century baptists such as h wheeler robinson george beasley murray stanley k fowler and anthony r cross

king solomon asserted love is as strong as death song of solomon 8 6 solomon the wisest of all israel s kings recognized that while every human would eventually succumb to death death is not ultimate in power the god whose essence is love designed and created both human life and death as instruments for the display of his own splendor and purposes neither human life nor death then can deviate from god s ultimate purpose and good for the creature made in his own image biblically death serves as the perfect foil to mark both the immeasurable value of human life and at the same time the relatively limited value of it rather than either worshipping or desecrating this finite gift of human life we can value it rightly and also worship the god who in his literally infinite wisdom gives and takes away life in accord with his good and gracious purposes
