in 1927 chiang kai shek the head of china's military academy and leader of the kuomintang kmt began the northern expeditions to bring china's northern territories back under the control of the state it was during this period that the kmt purged communist activities fractured the army and sparked the chinese civil war which would rage for over twenty years the communists led by general mao tse tsung were for much of the period forced underground and concentrated in the chinese countryside as the author argues this resulted in china's war featuring unusually high levels of espionage and sabotage and increased the military importance of information gathering based on newly declassified material panagiotis dimitrakis charts the double crossings secret meetings and bloody assassinations which would come to define china's future uniquely the secret war for china gives equal weighting to the role of foreign actors the role of british intelligence in unmasking communist international comintern agents in china for example and the allies attempts to turn nationalist china against the japanese the secret war for china also documents the clandestine confrontation between mao and chiang and the secret negotiations between chiang and the axis powers whose forces he employed against the ccp once the second world war was over in his turn mao employed nationalist forces who had defected during the last three years of the civil war about 105 out of 869 kmt generals defected to the ccp this book is an urgent and necessary guide to the intricacies of the chinese civil war a war which decisively shaped the modern asian world

the invasion of iraq in 2003 and the coalition government's failure to win parliamentary approval for armed intervention in syria in 2013 mark a period of increased scrutiny of the process by which the uk engages in armed conflict for much of the media and civil society there now exists a constitutional convention which mandates that the government consults parliament before commencing hostilities this is celebrated as representing a redistribution of power from the executive towards a more legitimate democratic institution this book offers a critical inquiry into parliament's role in the war prerogative since the beginning of the twentieth century evaluating whether the uk's decisions to engage in conflict meet the recognised standards of good governance accountability transparency and participation the analysis reveals a number of persistent problems in the decision making process including parliament's lack of access to relevant information government legalisation of parliamentary debates which frustrates broader discussions of political legitimacy and the skewing of debates via the partial public disclosure of information based upon secret intelligence the book offers solutions to these problems to reinvigorate parliamentary discourse and to address government withholding of classified information it is essential reading for anyone interested in war powers the relationship between international law and domestic politics and the role of the westminster parliament in questions of national security

to understand serbian nationalism requires profound attention to history and careful analysis cohen accomplishes both through years of studying primary sources never before translated focusing on world war ii and uncovering the foundations of ethnic cleansing he argues that the serbs collaborated with the nazis in contrast to later serbian rhetoric that claimed the serbs were victims the thirteenth tribe of israel this official duplicity veiled the true objectives of the government to create an ethnically pure homeland annotation copyright by book news inc portland or

the key part played by winston churchill in shaping the course of the second world war is still of great interest to historians worldwide in the course of his research robin denniston has uncovered previously unknown files of diplomatic intercepts which show that churchill s role in british foreign policy and war planning was far more significant than has hitherto been supposed although neither a commander in chief nor a head of state he personally exerted considerable influence on british foreign policy to force turkey into the second world war on the side of the allies this ground breaking book explores churchill s use of secret signals intelligence before and during the second world war and also sheds fresh light on britain s relations with turkey a subject which has not received the attention it deserves the book examines a little known plan to open a second front in the balkans from turkey across the eastern mediterranean designed to hasten d day in the west and reveals new information on the 1943 cicero spy scandal the biggest foreign office security lapse until the burgess and maclean affair some twenty years later

in one of the most remote covert campaigns of the cold war the cia harnessed nurtured and encouraged the khampa tribesmen of tibet in their defiance against chinese subjugation this is the first time the story has been told

the soviet invasion of afghanistan in support of a marxist leninist government and the subsequent nine year conflict with the indigenous afghan mujahedeen was one of the bloodiest conflicts of the cold war key details of the circumstances surrounding the invasion and its ultimate conclusion only months before the fall of the berlin wall in november 1989 have long remained unclear it is a confidential narrative of clandestine correspondence covert operations and failed intelligence the secret war in afghanistan undertakes a full analysis of recently declassified intelligence archives in order to asses anglo american secret intelligence and diplomacy relating to the invasion of afghanistan and unveil the cold war realities behind the rhetoric rooted at every turn in close examination of the primary evidence it outlines the secret operations of the cia mi6 and the kgb and the full extent of the aid and intelligence from the west which armed and trained the afghan fighters drawing from us uk and russian archives panagiotis dimitrakis analyses the chinese arms deals with the cia the multiple recorded intelligence failures of kgb intelligence and secret letters from the office of margaret thatcher to jimmy carter in so doing this study brings a new scholarly perspective to some of the most controversial events of cold war history dimitrakis also outlines the full extent of china s involvement in arming the mujahedeen which led to the prc effectively fighting the soviet union by proxy this will be essential reading for scholars and students of the cold war american history and the modern middle east

the secret war council germany s spy organization in new york received orders from berlin to stop the flow of munitions through terrorism in january 1915 german agents in the u s firebombed freighters on the high seas incited labor unrest fomented troubles along the mexican american border and damaged or destroyed dozens of american factories and logistics installations the german secret war against the united states in 1915 its discovery and publication combined with the disastrous sinking of the lusitania in may of that year did much to prepare the american public to finally accept joining the entente powers against germany in 1917 this is the story of a group of german agents in the united states who executed this mission

this title surveys israeli intelligence operations from the 1930s to the ostrovsky affair and describes relations with the american intelligence community

gordon thomas has established himself as a leading expert on the intelligence community he returns here on the one hundredth anniversaries of britain s security and secret intelligence services to provide the definitive history of the famed mi5 and mi6 these agencies rank as two of the oldest and most powerful in the world and thomas s wide sweeping history chronicles a century of both triumphs and failures he recounts the roles that british intelligence played in the

allied victory in world war ii the postwar treachery of great britain's own agents the defection of soviet agents and the intricate process of handling them the often frigid relationship that both agencies have had with the cia european spy services and the mossad the cooperation between the british and americans in the search for osama bin laden and the ways in which mi5 and mi6 have fought biological warfare espionage and space terrorism all told this is the story of two agencies led by men and women who are enigmatic eccentric and controversial and who ruthlessly control their spies based on prodigious research and interviews with significant players from inside the british intelligence community this is a rich and even delicious history packed with intrigue and information that only the author could have attained

though officially neutral until march 1945 buenos aires played a key role during world war ii as a base for the south american intelligence operations of the major powers the hidden war in argentina reveals the stories of the spymasters british americans and germans who plotted against each other throughout the second world war in argentina in buenos aires johannes siegfried becker codename sargo was the man responsible for organizing most of the nazi intelligence gathering in latin america and the leader of operation bolivar which sought to bring south america into the war on the side of the axis powers after the attack on pearl harbor the us state department pressured every south american country to join it in declaring war on germany and j edgar hoover authorized huge investments in south american intelligence operations argentina continued to refuse to join the conflict triggering a us embargo that squeezed the country's economy to breaking point buenos aires continued to be a hub for espionage even as the war in europe was ending hundreds of high ranking nazi exiles sought refuge there this book is based on newly declassified files and details of the operations of mi6 the abwehr the sicherheitsdienst sd and the fbi as well as the oss and the soe most significantly the hidden war in argentina reveals for the first time the coups of britain's mi6 in south america

a history of winning intelligence practices from the spanish armada to cyberwar that offers timeless practical lessons we ignore at our peril according to conventional wisdom strategic surprise and other intelligence failures are both inevitable and ultimately irrelevant because at least in international politics and war military muscle matters more than brains in decision advantage jennifer e sims counters this argument by investigating the history of intelligence through centuries of international conflict including the 16th century's spanish armada two us civil war battles the hunt for president lincoln's assassin and key diplomatic crises before the two world wars sims dives deep into these events to show that the competitive pursuit of intelligence advantage has been a measurable buildable and consequential form of power that can help competitors win against otherwise stronger opponents from these observations the author develops a general guide to building intelligence readiness whether for war diplomacy or international manhunts refuting arguments that intelligence is a sideshow because intentions are unknowable and predictions risky she redefines success as gaining information advantages over an adversary prescribes four practical pathways for gaining them and confirms what seems to be simple common sense smart competitors know how to learn and the ones who learn best tend to win thinking of intelligence in this way sims argues adds a moral character to an enterprise that is

too often mired in excessive secrecy and tyrannical agendas by lifting the veil on international politics decision advantage shows how good intelligence can lessen the likelihood of wars of misperception and folly

the covert clandestine operations of the special air service sas regiment from the jungles of malaya borneo and brunei to the deserts and mountains of the middle east and afghanistan have always been the focus of intense fascination stoked by the regiment's closed organization and secretive activities however no period of activity has remained more secret than the vital years in the immediate aftermath of world war ii when the regiment seemingly expired only to rise miraculously from the dead to fight communism in the malaya emergency tim jones fascinating history pieces together the evidence to show that while the malaya emergency re-established the sas as a unique source of counter guerilla expertise the regiment was not disbanded in 1945 and was in fact covertly involved in the greek civil war of 1945-49 a war unmatched in savagery until the bosnian conflict in the 1990s revealing important operational secrets and shedding new light on post war history this book will be essential reading for enthusiasts of military history and those interested in the world of intelligence

in *beyond the quagmire* thirteen scholars from across disciplines provide a series of provocative important and timely essays on the politics combatants and memory of the vietnam war americans believed that they were supposed to win in vietnam as veteran and pulitzer prize winning author philip caputo observed in a rumor of war we carried along with our packs and rifles the implicit convictions that the viet cong would be quickly beaten and that we were doing something altogether noble and good by 1968 though vietnam looked less like world war ii's triumphant march and more like the brutal and costly stalemate in korea during that year the united states paid dearly as nearly 17 000 perished fighting in a foreign land against an enemy that continued to frustrate them indeed as caputo noted we kept the packs and rifles the convictions we lost it was a time of deep introspection as questions over the legality of american involvement political dishonesty civil rights counter cultural ideas and american overreach during the cold war congealed in one place vietnam just as americans fifty years ago struggled to understand the nation's connection to vietnam scholars today across disciplines are working to come to terms with the long and bloody war its politics combatants and how we remember it the essays in *beyond the quagmire* pose new questions offer new answers and establish important lines of debate regarding social political military and memory studies the book is organized in three parts part 1 contains four chapters by scholars who explore the politics of war in the vietnam era in part 2 five contributors offer chapters on vietnam combatants with analyses of race gender environment and chinese intervention part 3 provides four innovative and timely essays on vietnam in history and memory in sum *beyond the quagmire* pushes the interpretive boundaries of america's involvement in vietnam on the battlefield and off and it will play a significant role in reshaping and reinvigorating vietnam war historiography

imperial connections challenges the eurocentrism implicit in many accounts of modern european empires focusing on the british empire when it was at its zenith metcalf analyzes the pivotal role the raj played in the running of the empire in regions as far flung from one another as say egypt uganda natal and the malay peninsula this innovative book is a real tour de force from a respected and versatile historian of india dipesh chakrabarty author of provincializing europe postcolonial thought and historical difference as he has done regularly throughout his career thomas metcalf has once again refreshed the study of british imperial history with a bold new perspective imperial connections puts south asians soldiers policemen and labourers right at the heart of his study c a bayly cambridge university author of the birth of the modern world this is a distinctly original study which re centers colonial power in provocative ways metcalf asks a simple question why were indians so persistently to be found elsewhere in the british empire and in such significant numbers then elegantly offers answers that force us to re think the operations of imperial power in critical ways wide ranging elegantly written and meticulously researched metcalf s is an important and a persuasive study philippa levine author of prostitution race and politics policing venereal disease in the british empire and forthcoming the british empire sunrise to sunset

the syrian social nationalist party devoted itself to reviving and unifying the syrian nation and establishing this nation s complete independence over its historical homeland greater syria it continues its struggle today influencing and shaping lebanese and syrian society and politics yet the party remains largely unknown and misunderstood a condition that stems from the lack of any comprehensive study of it this book fills this gap syrian nationalism and nationalist movements generally speaking have been largely neglected and ignored by historians scholars and observers of the middle east so too has the ssnp the lack of detailed and nuanced analyses has left significant gaps in the party s rich history unaddressed and enabled the perpetuation of inaccuracies and misperceptions regarding its past given this and the party s ongoing relevance in lebanon and syria a thorough examination of the early history of the ssnp the political organization and movement that embodied syrian nationalism s most explicit most cogent expression is even more necessary based on an extensive and thorough examination of arabic french and english primary sources the monograph is the first comprehensive systematic history of the ssnp to date detailing its struggle to fulfill its nationalist vision and establish a secular independent state in greater syria through a thorough analysis of its formation evolution and political activities in lebanon and syria

the operation known as market garden made famous in the book and film a bridge too far was the largest airborne assault in history up to that time a high risk allied invasion of enemy territory that has become a legend of world war ii even as it still invites criticism from historians now a thrilling and revelatory new book re creates the operation as never before revealing for the first time the full adventures of the bold jedburgh paratroopers whose exploits were almost unimaginably risky and heroic kicked off on september 17 1944 market garden was intended to secure crucial bridges

in the nazi occupied netherlands by a parachute assault conducted by three allied airborne divisions capture of the bridges would allow a swift advance and crossing of the rhine by british ground forces jedburgh teams allied special forces were dropped into the netherlands to train and use the dutch resistance in support of the larger operation based on new firsthand testimony of survivors and declassified documents abundance of valor concentrates on the three teams that operated farthest behind enemy lines the nine men whose treacherous missions resulted in deaths captures and hair breadth escapes here in unprecedented detail are the heat and stench of fuel oil and sweat in the troop carriers going over the remarkable and misleading initial success of the daylight parachute landings and the deadly brutally effective german response particularly by crack ss armored units in the blood soaked town of arnhem abundance of valor portrays with stunning verisimilitude the experiences of lt harvey allan todd who fought from a surrounded position against overwhelming numbers of the enemy before surviving capture near starvation interrogation and solitary confinement in german pow camps and maj john pappy olmsted who made a hazardous journey in disguise from safe house to safe house through enemy territory until finally reaching friendly lines with piercing criticism of the mission s ultimate failure from faulty use of intelligence and field marshall montgomery s distrust of the dutch underground abundance of valor is a brutally honest and truly inspiring account of fighting men in a noble cause who did their jobs with extraordinary honor and courage

the border patrol police bpp of thailand was formed as a united states cia s paramilitary intelligence force in the early 1950s in the early 1960s changes in thailand s political leadership and the u s government s strategies for fighting the spread of communism in southeast asia led to a transformation of the bpp the organization became a civic action agency supported by the united states agency for international development and the thai monarchy its civic actions pinned on advancing anticommunist modernization civilian counterinsurgency and royalist nationalism soon extended from the margins to the center of thailand and contributed to building the border of thainess khwam pen thai the growing tension between the royalist network consisting of military and rightwing groups and the democratization movements culminated in a massacre on october 6 1976 the village scout a rural vigilante group that the bpp created through its civic actions and the police aerial reinforcement unit paru a subunit of the bpp attacked peaceful protesters at thammasat university the success of a military coup on the same day solidified the victory of the royalist network and it would continue to dominate thai politics and society into the post cold war era through a study of the border patrol police s transformations indigenizing the cold war shows how the thai ruling elite unfailingly pursued their nation building with an introduction of the indigenization concept and an in depth analysis of postcolonial nation building this work challenges conventional cold war studies the cold war in thailand was not always and only about an ideological conflict between the communist and anticommunist it was a war between the local ruling elite and the people each pushing forward their visions for constructing a new nation state the indigenization framework reveals the nature of the collaboration between the global superpowers and the asian local ruling elite who took advantage of the american cold war for legitimizing and continuing their authoritarian regimes

the vietnam war lasted twenty years and was the usa s greatest military failure an attempt to stem the spread of soviet and chinese influence the conflict in practice created a chaotic state torn apart by espionage terrorism and guerilla warfare american troops quickly became embroiled in jungle warfare and knowledge of the other side s troop movements communication lines fighting techniques and strategy became crucial panagiotis dimitrakis uncovers this battle for intelligence and tells the story of the vietnam war through the newly available british american and french sources including declassified material in doing so he dissects the limitations of the cia the nsa the mi6 and the french intelligence the sdece in gathering actionable intelligence dimitrakis also shows how the vietminh under ho chi minh established their own secret services how their high

grade moles infiltrated the us and french military echelons and the government of south vietnam and how hanoi s intelligence apparatus eventually suffered seriously from spies amongst us paranoia in doing so he enhances our understanding of the war that came to define its era

richard breitman s official secrets is an important work based on newly declassified archives as defeat loomed over the third reich in 1945 its officials tried to destroy the physical and documentary evidence about the nazis monstrous crimes about their murder of millions great britain already had some of the evidence however for its intelligence services had for years been intercepting decoding and analyzing german police radio messages and ss ones too yet these important papers were sealed away as most secret never to be removed from this office and they have only now reappeared integrating this new evidence with other sources richard breitman reconsiders how germany s leaders brought about the holocaust and when and reassesses britain s and america s suppression of information about the nazi killings his absorbing account of the tensions between the two powers and the consequences of keeping this information secret for so long shows us the danger of continued government secrecy which serves none of us well and the failure to punish many known war criminals

this biography of britain s spy chief during the revolutionary war sheds new light on his conspiracy with benedict arnold and his mysterious capture john andré was head of the british army s secret service in north america as the revolutionary war entered its most decisive phase in 1780 he masterminded the defection of the high ranking american general benedict arnold as the commander of west point arnold agreed to turn the strategically vital fort over to the british andré and arnold also conspired to kidnap george washington the secret negotiations between arnold and andré were protracted and fraught with danger arnold s wife peggy acted as go between until september 21st 1780 when the two men met face to face in no man s land but then andré was captured forty eight hours later having broken every condition set by his commanding officer he was within american lines wearing civilian clothes and carrying maps of west point in his boots when he announced himself as a spy the americans had no recourse tried by a military tribunal he was convicted and hanged andré s motives for his apparent sacrifice have baffled historians for generations this biography provides a provocative answer to this mystery explaining not only why he acted as he did but how he wished others to see his actions
