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the historical dictionary of italian cinema provides a better understanding of the role italian cinema has played in film history through a chronology an introductory essay a bibliography appendixes black white photos and hundreds of cross referenced dictionary entries on actors actresses movies producers organizations awards film credits and terminology

the movement known as neorealism lasted seven years generated only twenty one films failed at the box office and fell short of its didactic and aesthetic aspirations yet it exerted such a profound influence on italian cinema that all the best postwar directors had to come to terms with it whether in seeming imitation the early olmi in commercial exploitation the middle comencini or in ostensible rejection the recent tavianis despite the reactionary pressures of the marketplace and the highly personalized visions of fellini antonioni and visconti italian cinema has maintained its moral commitment to use the medium in socially responsible ways if not to change the world as the first neorealists hoped then at least to move filmgoers to face the pressing economic political and human problems in their midst from rossellini s open city 1945 to the taviani brothers night of the shooting stars 1982 the author does close readings of seventeen films that tell the story of neorealism s evolving influence on italian postwar cinematic expression other films discussed are de sica s bicycle thief and umberto d de santis s bitter rice comencini s bread

from cinema s beginnings filmmakers have turned to the past for their stories so much so that in many ways our historical culture is shaped more in the movie theatre than in the classroom inside the historical film argues how and why film can enrich our understanding of the past bruno ramirez discusses a wide range of films from various historical and national contexts pointing to the role that film crafts play in translating historical events into cinematic language he takes the reader through the process of conception research design and production of several films that he researched and co wrote explaining the decisions that were made to best convey historical knowledge the practice based quality at the core of ramirez s analysis is further enhanced by conversations with world renowned film directors including denys arcand constantin costa gavras deepa mehta renzo rossellini paolo and vittorio taviani and margarethe von trotta grounded in an appreciation for the interpretative value of making films and cinema s ability to reach large public audiences at personal and emotional levels inside the historical film seeks to understand historical films as both creative works and multi layered representations of the past

the history of cinema and notably that of post war italian cinema can only be understood adequately in the context of other contiguous cultural disciplines world literature including that of france germany and russia played a key role in the development of post war italian film and the cinematic technique it has come to embody moving away from the usual modes of defining this period a trajectory that begins with neorealism and ends with bertolucci author carlo testa offers proof that coming to terms with literary texts is an essential step toward understanding the motion pictures they influenced the means of recreating literature for the screen has changed drastically over the last half century as has the impact of different national traditions on italian cinema testa s work is the first to explicitly and deliberately link postwar italian cinema to general intellectual concerns such as the relationship between literary authors and cinematic auteurs moreover his analysis of the impact of french german and russian cultures on italy brings forth a new reading of italian cinema a new paradigm for exploring complex issues of authorship culture and art

this rich wide ranging book explores italy s national film style by relating it closely to politics and to the historicist

double lives film composers in the concert hall is a collection of fifteen essays dealing with iconic film composers who perhaps to the surprise of many fans of film music nevertheless maintained lifelong careers as composers for the concert hall featured composers include erich wolfgang korngold franz waxman miklós rózsa bernard herrmann nino rota leonard rosenman and ennio morricone progressing in chronological order the chapters offer accounts of the various composers concert hall careers and descriptions of their concert hall styles each chapter compares the composer s music for films with his or her music for the concert hall and speculates as to how music in one arena might have affected music in the other for each composer discussed in the book complete filmographies and complete works lists are included as appendices double lives film composers in the concert hall is accessible for scholars researchers and general readers with an interest in film music and concert music

in recent italian cinema two fundamental questions are asked the first concerns whether italian cinema as national cinema is in reality reduced to a niche market in its own territory the second relates to what italian audiences do with domestic films for nearly two decades most italian films have been produced outside box office returns through a practice of subsidy and co financing between many institutional and private entities thus italian cinema has had to define its mode of production and use value of films in a different way it is clear that it is no longer possible to separate national cinemas from the grip that the american film industry has on world markets in terms of imagination and modes of production distribution and exhibition it is thus only by examining the multiple layers of description and analysis which take into account the presence of hollywood that we can come to an understanding of what recent italian cinema actually is

carlo testa demonstrates that while pairings of famed directors and writers are commonplace in modern italian cinema the study of the interrelation between italian cinema and european literature has been almost completely neglected in film scholarship

unfinished business is the first book to examine italian mafia cinema of the past decade it provides insightful analyses of popular films that sensationalize violence scapegoat women or repress the homosexuality of male protagonists dana renga examines these works through the lens of gender and trauma theory to show how the films engage with the process of mourning and healing mafia related trauma in italy unfinished business argues that trauma that has yet to be worked through on the national level is displaced onto the characters in the films under consideration in a mafia context female characters are sacrificed and non normative sexual identities are suppressed in order to solidify traditional modes of viewer identification and to assure narrative closure all so that the image of the nation is left unblemished

the study of literature and culture is marked by various distinct understandings of passages both as phenomena and critical concepts these include the anthropological notion of rites of passage the shopping arcades passagen theorized by walter benjamin the middle passage of the atlantic slave trade present day forms of migration and resettlement and understandings of translation and adaptation whether structural semiotic spatial geographic temporal existential societal or institutional passages refer to processes of status change they enable entrances and exits arrivals and departures while they also foster moments of liminality and suspension they connect and thereby

engender difference passages is an exploration of passages as contexts and processes within which liminal experiences and encounters are situated it aims to foster a concept based interdisciplinary dialogue on how to approach and theorize such a term based on the premise that concepts travel through times contexts and discursive settings a conceptual approach to passages provides the authors of this volume with the analytical tools to re focus their research questions and create a meaningful exchange across disciplinary national and linguistic boundaries contributions from senior scholars and early career researchers whose work focuses on areas such as cultural memory performativity space media cultural translation ecocriticism gender and race utilize specific understandings of passages and liminality reflecting on their value and limits for their research

How many Zavattinis are there during a life spanning most of the twentieth century the screenwriter who wrote *Sciuscià* *Bicycle Thieves* *Miracle in Milan* and Umberto D was also a pioneering magazine publisher in 1930s Milan a public intellectual a theorist a tireless campaigner for change within the film industry a man of letters a painter and a poet this intellectual biography is built on the premise that in order to understand Zavattini's idea of cinema and his legacy of ethical and political cinema including guerrilla cinema we must also tease out the multi faceted strands of his interventions and their interplay over time the book is for general readers students and film historians and anyone with an interest in cinema and its fate

This book traces the development of investigative cinema whose main characteristic lies in reconstructing actual events political crises and conspiracies these documentary like films refrain from a simplistic reconstruction of historical events and are mainly concerned with what does not immediately appear on the surface of events

consequently they raise questions about the nature of the truth promoted by institutions newspapers and media reports by highlighting unanswered questions they leave us with a lack of clarity and the questioning of documentation becomes the actual narrative investigative cinema is examined in relation to the historical conjunctures of the economic miracle in italy the simultaneous decolonization and reordering of culture in france the waves of globalization and neoliberalism in post dictatorial latin america and the post watergate post 9 11 climate in us society investigative cinema is exemplified by the films salvatore giuliano the battle of algiers the parallax view gomorrah zero dark thirty and citizenfour

from its birth in 1913 to its abolition in 2021 film censorship marked the history of italian cinema and its evolution mirrored the social political and cultural travail of the country during the fascist regime and in the postwar period censorship was a powerful political tool in the hands of the ruling party many films were banned or severely cut by the end of the 1960s censors had to cope with the changing morals and the widespread diffusion of sexuality in popular culture which led to the boom of hardcore pornography with the crisis of the national industry and the growing influence of television censorship gradually changed its focus and targets the book analyzes italian film censorship from its early days to the present discussing the most controversial cases and protagonists these include such notorious works as last tango in paris and salo or the 120 days of sodom and groundbreaking filmmakers such as luchino visconti federico fellini and pier paolo pasolini who pushed the limits of what was acceptable on screen causing scandal and public debate
