politically speaking do heroes matter are we living in a post heroic age the republican hero addresses both these questions the general tenor of modern thinking is that heroes do matter but that the modern age is characterized by a narrowing of moral horizons once illuminated by heroes

secular and spiritual michael lusztig argues that the modern world is not post heroic he makes the case that the modern age is the most heroic age if measured in terms of the aristotelian currency of balance and completeness to this end he identifies four main hero types the epic magnanimous romantic and common each can rightfully be called a republican hero each contributes to the promotion or protection or provision of republican values each exemplifies the heroic virtues of their age however taken conjunctively each contributes to what lusztig conceives as the complete republican hero of the modern age

this 2001 biography reassesses philosopher karl popper s life and works within the context of interwar vienna

in the reincarnation myth in book x of plato s republic the unnamed first soul who has lived a good life and has been rewarded in the afterlife chooses a new life and fate and chooses catastrophically badly he finds himself fated to eat his own children despite being warned to blame only himself he wails and blames anything and everything else in his conviction that his fate is undeserved though he should not be shocked because he has made this choice himself he is incredulous because he has completely misunderstood the nature of his choice starting with plato s myth this book looks at the errors this soul has made and considers these errors through both the republic and a series of paired shakespeare plays reading the republic along with othello and the comedy of errors the first section focuses on the misreading of comedy and tragedy in the life of the individual returning to the republic and using the merchant of venice and pericles part ii focuses on the broadened context of the misuse of political and economic forces returning again to the republic and reading timon of athens and measure for measure part iii focuses on the broadest context the misunderstanding of the inseparability of birth and infinite debt the hope of the text and the hope of human life is to help us avoid choosing lives that devour what we most love

this book explores the contributions of east asian traditions particularly buddhism and daoism to environmental philosophy in dialogue with european philosophy it critically examines the conceptions of human responsibility toward nature and across time presented within these traditions the volume rethinks human relationships to the natural world by focusing on three main themes daoist and eurodaoist perspectives on nature human responsibility toward nature and buddhist perspectives on life and nature by way of discussing east asian traditions and european thinkers this collection reveals that the impact of humanity on the environment is shaped not only by distinctive modes of economic production but also by cultural beliefs and practices representing a unique constellation of environmental and intercultural philosophy the contributions present systematic approaches to the global need for cultivating environmental responsibility across cultures and generations to address the political ethical and aesthetic challenges arising from humanity s transformative impact on the natural world presenting a critical re evaluation of human relationships

to the natural world in dialogue with east asian traditions this will be a valuable resource for students and scholars of philosophy environmental studies and asian studies

any realist metaphysics must include an integrated account of the transcendentals and the analogy of being for an adequate metaphysics must be about everything and all things share in some key metaphysical characteristic being unity truth goodness and beauty however they do not share in them in exactly the same way therefore there is need to explain the transcendental characteristics in an analogical way by using the phrase transcendental analogies reason revelation and metaphysics claims that there are analogies of unity truth goodness and beauty which are related to but irreducible to the analogy of being as this book is a systematic study of the topic theoretical reason has primacy in the project and metaphysics is given pride of place but reason is practical and aesthetic as well that is our consciences urge us to seek what is good and we are delighted by what is beautiful although goodness and beauty are not reducible to truth they must be included in any adequate metaphysical account for metaphysics looks to explain everything although metaphysics is traditionally thought to be a philosophical project involving ontology and natural theology montague brown argues that an adequate metaphysics must ultimately be theological including within its scope the truths of revelation philosophical reason s examination of the transcendental analogies raises questions that it cannot answer we experience a world of many beings truths goods and beauties recognizing that these many instances have something in common we affirm a transcendent instance of each traditionally called god however although we know that a transcendent instance exists we do not know its nature therefore we cannot say how it is related to the other instances if we try to apply this transcendent instance as the prime analogate to shed light on the other analogates we must fail for the abstractness and universality of the transcendent instance can add nothing to our understanding of the particular instances wanting to know how the many exist and are related philosophical reason finds no way forward and recognizes its need for help it is the thesis of this book that reason finds this help only in the revelation of the god s

covenantal relation with the world the first principle of all things most perfectly revealed in Jesus Christ perfect God and perfect man is really and freely related to us only by accepting this revealed prime analogate can the transcendental analogies bear fruit in our ongoing quest for understanding

Plato c. 428–347 BCE stands at the beginning of many debates that have continued throughout the history of philosophy. His literary career spanned fifty years and the influence of his ideas and those of his followers pervaded philosophy throughout antiquity. Andrew Mason's lucid and engaging introduction draws on recent scholarship to offer a fresh general survey of Plato's philosophy, aware of the methodological challenges that confront any writer on Plato. This emphasizes a connection between the productions of knowledge, interpretation, and the way of life, ethos, that those productions involve and express. what is the nature of hell what role s may hell play in religious political or ethical thought can hell be justified this edited volume addresses these questions and others drawing philosophers from many approaches and traditions to analyze and examine hell

uniting mississippi applies a new philosophically informed theory of democratic leadership to mississippi s challenges governor william f winter has written a foreword for the book supporting its proposals the book begins with an examination of mississippi s apparent catch 22 namely the difficulty of addressing problems of poverty without fixing issues in education first and vice versa these difficulties can be overcome if we look at their common roots argues eric thomas weber and if we practice virtuous democratic leadership since the approach to addressing poverty has for so long been unsuccessful weber reframes the problem the challenges of educational failure reveal the extent to which there is a caste system of schooling certain groups of people are trapped in schools that are underfunded and failing the ideals of democracy reject hierarchies of citizenship and thus the author contends these ideals are truly tested in mississippi weber offers theories of effective leadership in general and of democratic leadership in particular to show how mississippi s challenges could be addressed with the guidance of common values the book draws on insights from classical and contemporary philosophical outlooks on leadership which highlight four key social

virtues wisdom courage moderation and justice within this framework the author approaches mississippi s problems of poverty and educational frustration in a novel way that is applicable in and beyond the rural south weber brings to bear each of the virtues of democratic leadership on particular problems with some overarching lessons and values to advance the author s editorial essays are included in the appendix as examples of engaging in public inquiry for the sake of democratic leadership

through a close textual analysis and a contrastive examination of documents from both cultures mark glouberman explores the biblical roots of our western sense of self identity and the ways in which non philosophical greek materials enhance our understanding of how that cultural view developed glouberman illustrates how the hebrew scriptures advance a humanist rather than a religious view of human nature he then shows that this same view is germinally present in non philosophical writings of archaic and classical greece finally glouberman argues that the philosophical style of thinking the intellectual basis of greece s contribution to the west is in fact hostile to what the bible teaches about human nature and that central hellenic figures from outside the philosophical mainstream notably homer and sophocles are biblical in orientation each of glouberman s theses lends new depth to contemporary research on the bible as a source of material that illuminates the human condition

Blake E. Hestir's examination of Plato's conception of truth challenges a long tradition of interpretation in ancient scholarship

This book addresses the problem of fully explaining Socrates' motives for philosophic interlocution in Plato's dialogues. Why, for instance, does Socrates talk to many philosophically immature and seemingly incapable interlocutors? Are his motives in these cases moral, prudential, erotic, pedagogic, or intellectual? In any one case, can Socrates' reasons for engaging an unlikely interlocutor be explained fully on the grounds of intellectual self-interest, i.e., the promise of advancing his own wisdom? Or does his activity, including his self-presentation and staging of his death, require additional motives for adequate explanation? Finally, how, if at all, does our conception of Socrates' motives help illuminate our understanding of the life of reason as Plato presents it? By inviting a multitude of authors to contribute their thoughts on these questions, all of whom share a commitment to close reading but by no means agree on the meaning of Plato's dialogues, this book provides the reader with an excellent map of the terrain of these problems and aims to help the student of Plato clarify the tensions involved, showing especially how each major stance on Socrates entails problematic assumptions that prompt further critical reflection.

In contradistinction to the many monographs and edited volumes devoted to historical, cultural, or theological treatments of demonology, this collection features newly written papers by philosophers and other scholars engaged specifically in philosophical argument, debate, and dialogue involving ideas and topics in demonology. The contributors to the volume approach the subject from the perspective of the broadest areas of Western philosophy, namely metaphysics, epistemology, logic, and moral philosophy. The collection also features a plurality of religious, cultural, and theological views on the nature of demons from both Eastern and Western thought, in addition to views that may diverge from these traditional roots. Philosophical approaches to demonology will be of interest to

philosophers of religion theologians and scholars working in philosophical theology and demonology as well as historians cultural anthropologists and sociologists interested more broadly in the concept of demons

a new way of looking at wittgenstein as an exile from an earlier cultural era ludwig wittgenstein's *tractatus logico philosophicus* 1922 and *philosophical investigations* 1953 are among the most influential philosophical books of the twentieth century and also among the most perplexing wittgenstein warned again and again that he was not and would not be understood moreover wittgenstein's work seems to have little relevance to the way philosophy is done today in *wittgenstein in exile* james klagge proposes a new way of looking at wittgenstein as an exile that helps make sense of this wittgenstein's exile was not despite his wanderings from vienna to cambridge to norway to ireland strictly geographical rather klagge argues wittgenstein was never at home in the twentieth century he was in exile from an earlier era oswald spengler's *culture of the early nineteenth century* klagge draws on the full range of evidence including wittgenstein's published work the complete *nachlaß* correspondence lectures and conversations he places wittgenstein's work in a broad context along a trajectory of thought that includes job goethe and dostoyevsky yet klagge also writes from an analytic philosophical perspective discussing such topics as essentialism private experience relativism causation and eliminativism once we see wittgenstein's exile klagge argues we will gain a better appreciation of the difficulty of understanding wittgenstein and his work

although kant was involved in the education debates of his time it is widely held that in his mature philosophical writings he remained silent on the subject in her groundbreaking *kant's conception of*

pedagogy g felicitas munzel finds extant in kant s writings the so called missing critical treatise on education it appears in the doctrines of method with which he concludes each of his major works in it kant identifies the fundamental principles for the cultivation of reason s judgment when it comes to cognition beauty nature and the exercise of morality while subject to the passions and inclinations that characterize the human experience from her analysis munzel extrapolates principles for a cosmopolitan education that parallels the structure of kant s republican constitution for perpetual peace with the formal principles in place the argument concludes with a query of the material principles that would fulfill the formal conditions required for an education for freedom
