the reader's love of the writing tends to become indistinguishable from his love of the writer beautiful writing has exercised its intoxicating power over readers since time immemorial and yet on occasion this seduction extends beyond the page and sparks an irreversible connection between author and reader this is a true literary seduction in literary seductions frances wilson demonstrates how some of history s most renowned writers were themselves ensuared by the writing they consumed and which in turn consumed them through a series of famous literary couples elizabeth barrett and robert browning anaïs nin and henry miller osip mandelstam and his wife nadezhda wilson evokes the evolution from literary seduction to sexual desire with stories of self sacrifice self effacement and even self immolation literary seductions recounts the powerful inflammatory and sometimes destructive nature of literature

this book provides a wide ranging history of every aspect of stalin's dictatorship over the peoples of the soviet union drawing upon a huge array of

primary and secondary sources the stalin era is a first hand account of stalinist thought policy and and their effects it places the man and his ideology into context both within pre revolutionary russia lenin s soviet union and post stalinist russia the stalin era examines collectivisation industrialisation terror government the cult of stalin education and science family religion the russian orthodox church art and the state

isaiah berlin was one of the great public intellectuals of his time a magnetic speaker and beacon of liberal philosophy he gained first hand experience of some of the pivotal events of the twentieth century and crossed paths with luminaries from virginia woolf to sigmund freud declining to write an autobiography berlin instead agreed to give extensive interviews to acclaimed writer michael ignatieff in the final decade of his life the result is a magisterial biography that penetrates deeply into berlin s life and thought while capturing his vivid style of conversation reissued in this updated edition it traces berlin s journey to become one of his era s most vigorous defenders of liberty and individuality in the face of tyranny and dogma

the true history of physics can only be read in the life stories of those who made its progress possible matvei bronstein was one of those for whom the vast territory of theoretical physics was as familiar as his own home he worked in cosmology nuclear physics gravitation semiconductors atmospheric physics quantum electrodynamics astro physics and the relativistic quantum theory everyone who knew him was struck by his wide knowledge far beyond the limits of his trade this partly explains why his life was closely intertwined with the social historical and scientific context of his time one might doubt that during his short life bronstein could have made truly weighty contributions to science and have become in a sense a symbol ofhis time unlike mathematicians and poets physicists reach the peak oftheir careers after the age of thirty his thirty years of life however proved enough to secure him a place in thegreatersovietencyclopedia in 1967 in describing the first generation of physicists educated after the 1917 revolution igor tamm referred to bronstein as an exceptionally brilliant and promising theoretician 268

winner of the pulitzer prize one of the best books of the year the new york times from the editor of the new yorker a riveting account of the collapse of the soviet union which has become the standard book on the subject lenin s tomb combines the global vision of the best historical scholarship with the immediacy of eyewitness journalism remnick takes us through the tumultuous 75 year period of communist rule leading up to the collapse and gives

us the voices of those who lived through it from democratic activists to party members from anti semites to holocaust survivors from gorbachev to yeltsin to sakharov an extraordinary history of an empire undone lenin s tomb stands as essential reading for our times

for years lydia chukovskaya s support for persecuted writers cut her off from her own audience even her name was banned in the ussr and she was expelled from the union of writers in 1974 though unable to publish at home and cut off from contacts with readers and editors chukovskaya continued to write to the memory of childhood her loving chronicle of growing up beside the gulf of finland with her father the writer kornei chukovsky reveals the sources of her strength and her belief in the power of the written word her father is a household name in russia because of his tales in verse for children but his literary accomplishments ranged far beyond bedtime stories as a critic he wrote controversial articles and lively profiles of cultural figures as a translator he introduced whitman twain kipling and wilde to russian readers when his children's literature was attacked in the 1920s and 1930s he turned to editing scholarship and articles on translation a man of boundless energy he played a vital role in his country's cultural life until his death in 1969 i am not writing kornei ivanovich's biography chukovskaya says but he was the author of my childhood

tamizdat offers a new perspective on the history of the cold war by exploring the story of the contraband manuscripts sent from the user to the west a word that means publishing over there tamizdat manuscripts were rejected censored or never submitted for publication in the soviet union and were smuggled through various channels and printed outside the country with or without their authors knowledge yasha klots demonstrates how tamizdat contributed to the formation of the twentieth century russian literary canon the majority of contemporary russian classics first appeared abroad long before they saw publication in russia examining narratives of stalinism and the gulag klots focuses on contraband manuscripts in the 1960s and 70s from khrushchev s thaw to stagnation under brezhnev klots revisits the traditional notion of late soviet culture as a binary opposition between the underground and official state publishing he shows that even as tamizdat represented an alternative field of cultural production in opposition to the soviet regime and the dogma of socialist realism it was not devoid of its own hierarchy ideological agenda and even censorship tamizdat is a cultural history of russian literature outside the iron curtain the russian literary diaspora was the indispensable ecosystem for these works yet in the post stalin

years they also served as a powerful weapon on the cultural fronts of the cold war laying bare the geographical stylistic and ideological rifts between two disparate yet inextricably intertwined fields of russian literature one at home the other abroad open access edition funded by the national endowment for the humanities

david cautes wide ranging study examines how outstanding novelists of the cold war era conveyed the major issues of contemporary politics and history in the united states and western europe the political novel flourished in the 1930s and 1940s the crisis years of economic depression fascism the spanish civil war the consolidation of stalinism and the second world war starting with the high hopes generated by the spanish civil war caute then explores the god that failed pessimism that overtook the western political novel in the 1940s the writers under scrutiny include hemingway dos passos orwell koestler malraux serge greene de beauvoir and sartre strikingly different approaches to the burning issues of the time are found among orthodox soviet novelists such as sholokhov fadeyev kochetov and pavlenko soviet official culture continued to choke on modernism formalism satire and allegory in russia and eastern europe dissident novelists offered contesting voices as they engaged in the fraught re telling of life under stalinism the emergence of the new left in the 1960s generated a new wave of fiction challenging americas global stance mailer doctorow and coover brought fresh literary sensibilities tobear on such iconic events as the 1967 siege of the pentagon and the execution of the rosenbergs

this book first published in 1984 was the first full biography of solzhenitsyn starting with his childhood it covers every period of his life in considerable detail showing how solzhenitsyn s development paralleled and mirrored the development of soviet society ambitious and idealistic in the twenties and thirties preoccupied with the struggle for survival in the forties hopeful in the fifties and sixties and disillusioned in the seventies solzhenitsyn s life thus serves as a paradigm for the history of twentieth century communism and for the intelligentsia s attitudes to communism at the same time this book relates solzhenitsyn s life to his works all of which contain a large element of autobiography

china s ascent to the ranks of the world's second largest economic power has given its revolution a better image than that of its russian counterpart yet the two have a great deal in common indeed the chinese revolution was a carbon copy of its predecessor until mao became aware not so much of

the failures of the russian model but of its inability to adapt to an overcrowded third world country yet instead of correcting that model mad decided to go further and faster in the same direction the aftershock of an earthquake may be weaker but the great leap forward of 1958 in china was far more destructive than the great turn of 1929 in the soviet union it was conceived with an idealistic end but failed to take all the possibilities into account china s development only took off after and thanks to made sheath once the country turned its back on the revolution lucien biancols original comparative study highlights the similarities the all powerful bureaucracy the over exploitation of the peasantry which triggered two of the worst famines of the 20th century control over writers and artists repression and labor camps the comparison of stalin and made that completes the picture leads the author straight back to lenin and he quotes the observation by a chinese historian that if at all possible it is best to avoid revolutions altogether

this splendid book paints a rich portrait of the russian avant garde and the intrigues which it saved for posterity roberts has written a fascinating history of the famous costakis collection and its creator george costakis who for nearly thirty years was an administrative clerk in the canadian embassy in moscow until his forced departure from russia in 1978 he collected continually and painstakingly the abstract constructivist and supremacist art of 1912 to 1930 which fell into official disrepute under stalin the author a former canadian ambassador to moscow is a first hand

ib was one of the great affirmers of our time john banville new york review of books the title of this final volume of isaiah berlin's letters is echoed by john banville's verdict in his review of its predecessor building letters 1960 75 which saw berlin publish some of his most important work and create in oxford's wolfson college an institutional and architectural legacy in the period covered by this new volume 1975 97 he consolidates his intellectual legacy with a series of essay collections these generate many requests for clarification from his readers and stimulate him to reaffirm and sometimes refine his ideas throwing substantive new light on his thought as he grapples with human issues of enduring importance berlin's comments on world affairs especially the continuing conflict between israel and the palestinians and the collapse of communism are characteristically acute this is also the era of the northern ireland troubles the iranian revolution the rise of solidarity in poland the chernobyl nuclear disaster the fall of the berlin wall ayatollah khomeini's fatwa against salman rushdie the spread of islamic fundamentalism and wars in the falkland islands the persian gulf and the balkans berlin scrutinises the leading politicians of the day including reagan thatcher and gorbachev and draws illuminating sketches of public figures notably contrasting the personas of alexander solzhenitsyn and andrey sakharov he declines a peerage is awarded the agnelli prize for ethics campaigns against philistine architecture in london and jerusalem helps run the national gallery and covent garden and talks at length to his

biographer he reflects on the ideas for which he is famous especially liberty and pluralism and there is a generous leavening of the conversational brilliance for which he is also renowned as he corresponds with friends about politics the academic world music and musicians art and artists and writers and their work always displaying a shakespearean fascination with the variety of humankind affirming is the crowning achievement both of berlin's epistolary life and of the widely acclaimed edition of his letters whose first volume appeared in 2004

sofia petrovna is lydia chukovskaya s fictional account of the great purge sofia is a soviet everywoman a doctor s widow who works as a typist in a leningrad publishing house when her beloved son is caught up in the maelstrom of the purge she joins the long lines of women outside the prosecutor s office hoping against hope for good news confronted with a world that makes no moral sense sofia goes mad a madness which manifests itself in delusions little different from the lies those around her tell every day to protect themselves sofia petrovna offers a rare and vital record of stalin s great purges

waiting for the muse poems of anna akhmatova presents new translations of the work of this great russian poet set in the context of her life akhmatova saw the source of her creativity as the appearance to her of the muse the embodiment of poetic inspiration in the poems written over her lifetime from the early love lyrics to poems of resistance during the stalinist terror to poems of remembrance as her life neared its end her conception of the muse changed with the circumstances of her life the muse first appeared as an unpredictable young woman then the classical figure of erato then a woman who stood beside her in the prison lines then a cruel taskmaster akhmatova herself became the muse for other russian poets ultimately akhmatova concluded that the muse may have been the torment she had been forced to suffer

she burst across the revolutionary sky like a blazing meteor dazzling all in her path trotsky wrote for the poet boris pasternak she was lara the heroine of his novel doctor zhivago commissar revolutionary fighter espionage agent journalist larisa reisner 1895 1926 was a model for the new woman of the russian revolution and one of its most popular and brilliant writers whose works were published in mass editions and read by millions her life is set against the world shaking events of 1917 and draws on material recently released from the soviet archives to tell her story through the memories of those close to her her own voluminous writings and her six books published for the first time together by brill with this biography this biography is accompanied by brill's publication of cathy porter and richard chappell's writings of larisa reisner published as volume 302 in the historical materialism book series
