In this second edition of his bestselling book author Art Kleiner explores the nature of effective leadership in times of change and defines its importance to the corporation of the future he describes a heretic as a visionary who creates change in large scale companies balancing the contrary truths they can't deny against their loyalty to their organizations the Age of Heretics reveals how managers can get stuck in counterproductive ways of doing things and shows why it takes a heretical point of view to get past the deadlock and move forward

The Scourge of America's Economy isn't the success of the 1 percent quite the opposite the real problem is the government's well meaning but misguided attempt to reduce the payoffs for success four years ago Edward Conard wrote a controversial bestseller Unintended Consequences which set the record straight on the financial crisis of 2008 and explained why U.S. growth was accelerating relative to other high wage economies he warned that loose monetary policy would produce neither growth nor inflation that expansionary fiscal policy would have no lasting benefit on growth in the aftermath of the crisis and that ill advised attempts to rein in banking based on misplaced blame would slow an already weak recovery unfortunately he was right now he's back with another provocative argument that our current obsession with income inequality is misguided and will only slow growth further using fact based logic Conard tracks the implications of an economy now constrained by both its capacity for risk taking and by a shortage of properly trained talent rather than by labor or capital as was the case historically he uses this fresh perspective to challenge the conclusions of liberal economists like Larry Summers and Joseph Stiglitz and the myths of crony capitalism more broadly instead he argues that the growing wealth of most successful Americans is not to blame for the stagnating incomes of the middle and working classes if anything the success of the 1 percent has put upward pressure on employment and wages Conard argues that high payoffs for success motivate talent to get the training and take the risks that gradually loosen the constraints to growth well meaning attempts to decrease inequality through redistribution dull these incentives gradually hurting not just the 1 percent but everyone else as well Conard outlines a plan for growing middle and working class wages in an economy with a near infinite supply of labor that is shifting from capital

intensive manufacturing to knowledge intensive innovation driven fields he urges us to stop blaming the success of the 1 percent for slow wage growth and embrace the upside of inequality faster growth and greater prosperity for everyone

the study of pre modern anthropology requires the close examination of the relationship between nature and human society which has been both precarious and threatening as well as productive soothing inviting and pleasurable much depends on the specific circumstances as the works by philosophers theologians poets artists and medical practitioners have regularly demonstrated it would not be good enough as previous scholarship has commonly done to examine simply what the various writers or artists had to say about nature while modern scientists consider just the hard core data of the objective world cultural historians and literary scholars endeavor to comprehend the deeper meaning of the concept of nature presented by countless writers and artists only when we have a good grasp of the interactions between people and their natural environment are we in a position to identify and interpret mental structures social and economic relationships medical and scientific concepts of human health and the messages about all existence as depicted in major art works in light of the current conditions threatening to bring upon us a global crisis it matters centrally to take into consideration pre modern discourses on nature and its enormous powers to understand the topoi and tropes determining the concepts through which we perceive nature nature thus proves to be a force far beyond all human comprehensibility being both material and spiritual depending on our critical approaches

every book relating the history of modern architecture features a large number of pages dedicated to avant garde designs and the formation of the modern movement in the interwar years and a similar number devoted to reconstruction and expansion after the second world war meanwhile as if owing to lack of understanding or convenient silence there is void of dark years of wars exile and misfortune about which little can be said however it was in these dark times as in so many other revealing moments in the history of culture that experimental and profoundly invigorating experiences were taking place architects and artists voluntarily or forcibly driven to the margins of social importance began to react to a culturally unsustainable situation of which we know very little even today in experiments with life itself francisco gonzalez de canales studies a series of unrelated cases from the late 1930s to the late 1950s that he refers to as domestic self experimentation

poetic critique is that not an oxymoron do these two forms of behavior the poetic and the critical not pull in different even opposite directions for many scholars working in the humanities today they largely do but that has not always been the case friedrich schlegel for one believed that critique worthy of its name must itself be poetic only then would it stand a chance of responding adequately to

the work of art taking schlegel's idea of poetische kritik as a starting point this volume reflects on the possibility of drawing these alleged opposites closer together in light of current debates about the legacy of critique it investigates whether a concept such as poetic critique or poetic criticism lends itself to enriching our intellectual practice by engaging with the poetic potential of criticism and the critical value of art and literature

the superpowers traces the development of the usa and russia later ussr from 1898 through to 2000 placing the cold war from inception to ending into the wider social economic and political context this is the first history of the two major participants and their relationship throughout the twentieth century the superpowers explores the intertwining history of the two powers chronologically and includes discussion of the inheritance of the two great powers and their imperial background world war one and the russian revolution capitalism and socialism world war two and its impact the conflicts in berlin czechoslovakia vietnam and afghanistan perestroika and the end of the ussr the significance of the events of 1991 and their legacy

at the end of the nineteenth century theodore roosevelt t s van dyke and other elite men began describing their big game hunting as manly sport with the rifle they also began writing about their experiences publishing hundreds of narratives of hunting and adventure in the popular press and creating a new literary genre in the process but why did so many of these big game hunters publish what was writing actually doing for them and what did it do for readers in exploring these questions the hunter elite reveals new connections among hunting narratives publishing and the american conservation movement beginning in the 1880s these prolific hunter writers told readers that big game hunting was a test of self restraint and manly virtues and that it was not about violence they also opposed their sportsmanlike hunting to the slaughtering of game by british imperialists even as they hunted across north america and throughout the british empire their references to americanism and manliness appealed to traditional values but they used very modern publishing technologies to sell their stories and by 1900 they were reaching hundreds of thousands of readers every month when hunter writers took up conservation as a cause they used that reach to rally popular support for the national parks and for legislation that restricted hunting in the us canada and newfoundland the hunter elite is the first book to explore both the international nature of american hunting during this period and the essential contributions of hunting narratives and the publishing industry to the north american conservation movement
