the turn of the screw is the most famous ghost story in english taught in numerous courses and widely popular beyond academia the narrator governess to two children at an isolated country house becomes convinced that the ghosts of two former servants are attempting to corrupt the children miles and flora but there is no evidence that anyone but the governess sees them the story builds inexorably towards its horrific climax the death of young miles a century of criticism has failed to resolve basic questions about the ghosts reality and the governess s mental stability it has also failed to integrate the story s complex narrative technique with a convincing account of its theme edward lobb s study is the first to argue that the governess s retrospective narration written a decade after the events reveals a double consciousness she scrupulously records her thoughts and feelings at the time but is also writing a severe indictment of her earlier possessiveness which led to flora s illness and miles s death professor lobb s interpretation sheds new light on a host of details in the story and shows its consistency with henry james s moral ideas his sense of tragedy and his frequent depiction of emotional tyranny this study avoids academic jargon and offers an accessible engaging and persuasive analysis which will appeal to students scholars and general readers alike

it is a peculiar sensation this double consciousness this sense of always looking at one s self through the eyes of others for adell w e b du bois s famous articulation of the twoness of black americans is the key to understanding the double bind which afflicts contemporary african american literary theory the book demands and deserves recognition as a cogent intervention yearbook of english studies

flatley argues that embracing melancholy can be a road back to contact with others and can lead people to an invigorated relationship with the world around them he demonstrates that a seemingly disparate set of modernist writers and thinkers

showed how aesthetic activity can give us the means to comprehend and change our relation to loss

how systemic racism and settler colonialism shapes the lives of people in the us today w e b du bois famously pondered a question he felt society was asking of him as a black man in america how does it feel to be a problem jessica vasquez tokos uses this question to examine how communities of color are constructed as problems and the numerous ramifications this has for their life trajectories uncovering how various members of racial groups understand and react to what their racial status means for inclusion in or exclusion from the nation burdens of belonging examines the historical underpinnings of the racial colonial hierarchy the influence this hierarchy has on lived experience and how racialized life experience influences the feelings perspectives and goals of people of color burdens of belonging is based on interviews with people in oregon from various racial groups and brings multiple racial groups opinions together to weigh in on the ways in which race contours national belonging and affects sense of self everyday life and wellness and aspirations for the future this book highlights the value of inquiring how people from various racial backgrounds perceive their fit in the nation and reveals how race matters to belonging in multifaceted ways filling a gap in research on the everyday effects of accumulated racial disadvantage burdens of belonging brings to the fore an analysis of how racial inequality settler colonialism and race relations penetrate multiple layers of social life and become etched into bodies and futures

provides a hands on approach to learning feminist research methods this book provides examples of the range of research questions feminists engage with issues of gender inequality violence against women body image issues as well as issues of discrimination of other ed marginalized groups

this incisive work examining obama s speeches and the theories of w e b dubois illuminates the influences of words and ideas choice the racial history of us citizenship is vital to our understanding of both citizenship and race robert e terrill argues that to invent a robust manner of addressing one another as citizens americans must draw on the indignities of racial exclusion that have stained citizenship since its inception in double consciousness and the rhetoric of barack obama terrill demonstrates how president barack obama s public address models such a discourse terrill contends that obama s most effective oratory invites his audiences to experience a form of double consciousness famously described by w e b du bois as a feeling of two ness resulting from the african american experience of always looking at one s self through the eyes of others an effect of cruel alienation this double consciousness can also offer valuable perspectives on society when addressing fellow citizens obama asks each to share in the peculiar sensation that du bois described through close analyses of selected speeches from obama s 2008 campaign and first presidential term this book argues that obama does not present double consciousness merely as a point of view but as an idiom with which we might speak to one another of course as du bois s work reminds us double consciousness results from imposition and encumbrance so that obama s oratory presents a mode of address that emphasizes the burdens of citizenship together with the benefits the price as well as the promise

examines the work of baldwin with a view toward determining which of his ideas might still contribute to the debate about current racial issues the persistence of racial disparities and the popularity of color blindness

while there have been a number of studies that have explored african american movement culture and african american movement politics rarely has the mixture of black music and black politics or rather black music as an expression of black movement politics been explored across several genres of african american movement music and certainly not with a central focus on the major soundtracks of the civil rights movement gospel freedom songs rhythm blues and rock roll here the mixture of music and politics emerging out of the civil rights movement is critically examined as an incredibly important site and source of spiritual rejuvenation social organization political education and cultural transformation not simply for the non violent civil rights soldiers of the 1950s and 1960s but for organic intellectual artist activists deeply committed to continuing the core ideals and ethos of the civil rights movement in the twenty first century civil rights music the soundtracks of the civil rights movement is primarily preoccupied with that liminal in between and often inexplicable place where black popular music and black popular movements meet and merge black popular movements are more than merely social and political affairs beyond social organization and political activism black popular movements provide much needed spaces for cultural development and artistic experimentation including the mixing of musical and other aesthetic traditions movement music experimentation has historically led to musical innovation and musical innovation in turn has led to new music that has myriad meanings and messages some social some political some cultural some spiritual and indeed some sexual just as black popular movements have a multiplicity of meanings this book argues that the music that emerges out of black popular movements has a multiplicity of meanings as well

w e b du bois was a public intellectual sociologist and activist on behalf of the african american community he profoundly shaped black political culture in the united states through his founding role in the naacp as well as internationally through the pan african movement du bois s sociological and historical research on african american communities and culture broke ground in many areas including the history of the post civil war reconstruction period du bois was also a prolific author of novels autobiographical accounts innumerable editorials and journalistic pieces and several works of history collected in one volume for the first time the world and africa and color and democracy are two of w e b du bois s most powerful essays on race he explores how to tell the story of those left out of recorded history the evils of colonialism worldwide and africa s and african s contributions to and neglect from world history more than six decades after w e b du bois wrote the world and africa and color and democracy they remain worthy guides for the twenty first century with a series introduction by editor henry louis gates jr and two introductions by top african scholars this edition is essential for anyone interested in world history
