an unflinching look at the origins philosophy meanings and impact of the radical form of conservatism that currently dominates american politics analyzing the literature books magazines newspapers and broadcast sources that define and promote conservatism toplin leads the reader on a provocative tour of the conservative mind as viewed by a liberal tour guide

today s political scene looks nothing like it did thirty years ago and that is due mostly to reagan s monumental reshaping of the republican party what few people realize however is that reagan s revolution did not begin when he took office in 1980 but in his failed presidential challenge to gerald ford in 1975 1976 this is the remarkable story of that historic campaign one that as reagan put it turned a party of pale pastels into a national party of bold colors featuring interviews with a myriad of politicians journalists insiders and observers craig shirley relays intriguing never before told anecdotes about reagan his staff the campaign the media and the national parties and shows how reagan instead of following the lead of the ever weakening republican party brought the party to him and almost single handedly revived it

a biography of the historian and public intellectual sir lewis namier from his origins in a secular jewish family in poland to recognition as the most important historian of his day whose revolutionary method was enshrined in the verb to namierise

this book which will come as a surprise to many educated observers and historians suggests that jews and jewish intellectuals have played a considerable role in the development and shaping of modern american conservatism the focus is on the rise of a group of jewish intellectuals and activists known as neoconservatives who began to impact on american public policy during the cold war with the soviet union and most recently in the lead up to and invasion of iraq it presents a portrait of the life and work of the original and small group of neocons including irving kristol norman podhoretz and sidney hook this group has grown into a new generation who operate as columnists in conservative think tanks like the heritage and the american enterprise institute at colleges and universities and in government in the second bush administration including such lightning rod figures as paul wolfowitz richard perle and elliot abrams the book suggests the neo cons have been so significant in reshaping modern american

conservatism and public policy that they constitute a neoconservative revolution

creating conservatism charts the vital role of canonical post world war ii 1945 1964 books in generating guiding and sustaining conservatism as a political force in the united states dedicated conservatives have argued for decades that the conservative movement was a product of print rather than a march a protest or a pivotal moment of persecution the road to serfdom ideas have consequences witness the conservative mind god and man at yale the conscience of a conservative and other mid century texts became influential not only among conservative office holders office seekers and well heeled donors but also at dinner tables school board meetings and neighborhood reading groups these books are remarkable both because they enumerated conservative political positions and because their memorable language demonstrated how to take those positions functioning in essence as debate handbooks taking an expansive approach the author documents the wide influence of the conservative canon on traditionalist and libertarian conservatives by exploring the varied uses to which each founding text has been put from the cold war to the culture wars creating conservatism generates original insights about the struggle over what it means to think and speak conservatively in america

multiculturalism and the politics of guilt extends paul gottfried s examination of western managerial government s growth in the last third of the twentieth century linking multiculturalism to a distinctive political and religious context the book argues that welfare state democracy unlike bourgeois liberalism has rejected the once conventional distinction between government and civil society gottfried argues that the west s relentless celebrations of diversity have resulted in the downgrading of the once dominant western culture the moral rationale of government has become the consciousness raising of a presumed majority population while welfare states continue to provide entitlements and fulfill the other material programs of older welfare regimes they have ceased to make qualitative leaps in the direction of social democracy for the new political elite nationalization and income redistributions have become less significant than controlling the speech and thought of democratic citizens an escalating hostility toward the bourgeois christian past explicit or at least implicit in the policies undertaken by the west and urged by the media is characteristic of what gottfried labels an emerging therapeutic state for gottfried acceptance of an intrusive political correctness has transformed the religious consciousness of western particularly protestant society the casting of true christianity as a religion of sensitivity only toward victims has created a precondition for extensive social engineering gottfried examines late twentieth century liberal christianity as the promoter of the politics of guilt metaphysical guilt has been transformed into self abasement in relation to the suffering just identified with racial cultural and lifestyle minorities unlike earlier proponents of religious liberalism the therapeutic statistis oppose anything including empirical knowledge that impedes the expression of social and cultural guilt in an effort to raise the self esteem of designated victims equally troubling to gottfried is the growth of an american empire that is influencing european values and fashions europeans have begun he says to embrace the multicultural movement that originated with american liberal protestantism s emphasis on diversity as essential for democracy he sees europeans bringing authoritarian zeal to enforcing ideas and behavior imported from the united states multiculturalism and the politics of guilt extends the arguments of the

john rutledge 1739 1800 was a wealthy planter and successful lawyer a leader in south carolina's colonial commons house of assembly and a delegate to the first and second continental congresses as chief executive of the state during most of the war for independence he was instrumental in its defense and recovery after the british conquest of 1780 one of the leading delegates to the united states constitutional convention in 1787 he served as chief justice of south carolina and briefly as associate justice of the u s supreme court

in radical betrayal anders w edwardsson delivers a provocative examination of how both liberal and neoconservative forces have undermined american exceptionalism the belief in america's unique character and role in world history tracing the evolution of american national identity from its founding through the present day edwardsson argues that the post world war ii era has witnessed a gradual erosion of the principles that once defined the american experiment from woodrow wilson's progressive idealism to franklin roosevelt's new deal from lyndon johnson's great society to george w bush's democratization agenda edwardsson methodically chronicles how political leaders have dramatically expanded federal power and global interventionism in ways that contradict america's founding vision the author demonstrates how both parties have contributed to what he sees as america's decline liberals through welfare state expansion and neoconservatives through misguided foreign wars most provocatively edwardsson argues that donald trump's presidency represented a potential return to traditional american principles before being undermined by establishment forces he warns that continued abandonment of american exceptionalism threatens not only the nation's prosperity but its very survival as a unified republic whether you agree with his analysis or not edwardsson's sweeping historical narrative challenges readers to reconsider the forces shaping american politics and identity in an increasingly polarized age if you enjoyed the case for nationalism by rich lowry the dying citizen by victor davis hanson or america in retreat by bret stephens you'll love radical betrayal

the nixon effect examines the 37th president's political legacy in broad ranging ways that make clear for the first time the breadth and duration of his influence on american political life the book argues that nixon is the key political figure in postwar american politics in multiple ways some barely acknowledged until now his legacy includes a

generational shift in the ideological orientations of both the republican and democratic parties the nixon influence both intentional and unintentional was to push both parties further out to their ideological poles so stark was nixon s influence on party identities that it shaped the hardened partisan polarization in washington today and the evolution of what has come to be called red and blue america stemming in part from this and also from nixon s scorched earth political warfare and eventually his watergate scandal we have also seen the evolution of politics as war where adversaries and ideological opponents are seen as evil or unpatriotic finally nixon s pioneering tactics from the identification of the silent majority to the southern strategy from triangulating between both parties and claiming the political center to launching the culture war with attacks on elites in media academia and the courts have shaped political communications and strategy ever since other books have argued for nixon s importance but douglas e schoen s is the first to take into account the full range of this fascinating man s influence while not discounting nixon s many misdeeds schoen treats his presidency and its importance with the seriousness and evenhandedness that the subject deserves

why do conservatives tell stories because it helps them win elections and assail liberal policies like health care reform and economic stimulus why is important but the what and the how behind the stories that conservatives tell are equally interesting and in this new

book david ricci reveals all he shows how conservative activists and candidates tell many tales that come together to project a large scale story a cultural narrative a vision of what america is and what it should do to prosper socially economically and politically liberals by contrast tend to look for theories rather than stories for mathematical explanations rather than theological axioms for data rather than anecdotes and for statistics rather than homilies the difference is paradoxical liberals are unlikely to fashion sweeping narratives that capture the public s attention and commitment yet conservatives may tell attractive stories like the ones that got us into iraq that momentarily capture voter support but end up costing the country more than it can afford

this volume of perspectives opens with two contrasting perspectives on the purpose of higher education at the dawning of the university age perspectives that continue to define the debate today a j angulo recreates the controversy surrounding the founding and early years of the massachusetts institute of technology whether presented as an alternative to or a repudiation of the prevailing classical liberal education mit was rejected as inherently inferior by college defenders george levesque offers a penetrating reappraisal of yale president noah porter 1870 1886 known almost solely for his role as a college defender porter is revealed as a vigorous scholar who became fixated with preserving the strengths of yale college as these matters were vigorously debated during these years porter s position was superseded by more powerful forces

a dazzling and infuriating portrait of fifty years of corporate influence in washington the wolves of k street is a not so guilty pleasure the new york times irresistibly dramatic spectacularly timely explosive in its revelations and impossible to put down in the 1970s washington s center of power began to shift away from elected officials in big marble buildings to a handful of savvy handsomely paid operators who didn t answer to any fixed constituency the cigar chomping son of an influential congressman an illustrious political fixer with a weakness for modern art a watergate era dirty trickster the city s favorite cocktail party host these were the sort of men who now ran washington over four decades they d chart new ways to turn their clients cash into political leverage abandoning favor trading in smoke filled rooms for increasingly sophisticated tactics such as shadow lobbying where underground campaigns sparked seemingly organic public outcries to pressure lawmakers into taking actions that would ultimately benefit corporate interests rather than ordinary citizens with billions of dollars at play these lobbying dynasties enshrined in washington a pro business consensus that would guide the country s political leaders democrats and republicans alike a good lobbyist could ghostwrite a bill or even secretly kill a piece of legislation supported by the president both houses of congress and a majority of americans yet nothing lasts forever amid a populist backlash to the soaring inequality these influence peddlers helped usher in dc s pro business alliance suddenly

began to fray and while the lobbying establishment would continue to invent new ways to influence washington the men who d built k street would soon find themselves under legal scrutiny on the verge of financial collapse or worse one would turn up dead behind the eighteenth green of an exclusive golf club with a 1 500 bottle of wine at his feed and bullet in his head an absorbing the atlantic engrossing and meticulously researched tale the guardian brought to life with novelistic detail and considerable narrative skill the new york times the wolves of k street is essential reading for anyone looking to understand how corporate interests are undermining american democracy
