love and loss life and death relic of a heart reveals itself to readers as a small collection of poems short stories random thoughts with images of etchings drawings and salt prints upon closer inspection of this relic one will find emotionally charged characters living through scenarios far from mundane and describing experiences surreal and dreamlike a young woman steals milk from her neighbor s porch daily and notices on each following morning that the house has grown bigger for reasons unknown a writer discovers that a single punctuation mark on his paper has taken on a life of its own an amateur photographer finds an antique camera that creates miniature flesh and blood versions of her picture subjects roah s central theme involves an examination of the self searching that arises from an alienation in human relationships the varied length poems short short stories and illustrations each represent the author artist s changing perceptions of different time periods within his life spanning from a decade old past events to recent occurrences each piece of writing and image in this exoskeletal muscle pulses with its own take on the often taken quest for self spiritualism meaning and love relic of a heart is a small collection of poems short stories random thoughts 25 images of etchings drawings and salt prints about love losses life death and everything that meddles in between

this new book from the author of the dramatic writer's companion approaches some of the same issues as its predecessor but from a slightly different angle it offers playwrights screenwriters and other dramatic writers in depth analysis of the dramatic architecture of three award winning contemporary american plays doubt a parable by john patrick shanley topdog underdog by suzan lori parks and the clean house by sarah ruhl each relatively brief chapter is devoted to a specific story element from characters and main event to emotional environment and back story with subsections that break down this element in each of the plays readers can choose to read across the chapters to follow the analysis of each play but the structure gives primary emphasis to the story elements comparing and contrasting how different writers have successfully handled them each chapter ends with a set of questions to help readers analyze and develop that element in their own work

this intriguing sampling of meiji works in the best possible translations the editors have sought out the most reliable first editions of texts also reproducing most of their original illustrations with few exceptions the translations presented here are the first in the english language this rich anthology will be welcomed by students and scholars of japan studies and by a wide general audience interested in japan s popular culture media culture and literature in translation

no reasonable person would deny that the sound of a falling pin is less intense than the feeling of a hot poker pressed against the skin or that the recollection of something seen decades earlier is less vivid than beholding it in the present yet john locke is quick to dismiss a blind man s report that the color scarlet is like the sound of a trumpet and thomas nagel similarly avers that such loose intermodal analogies are of little use in developing an objective phenomenology charles sanders peirce 1839 1914 by striking contrast maintains rather that the blind man is correct peirce s reasoning stems from his phenomenology which has received little attention as compared with his logic pragmatism or semiotics peirce argues that one can describe the similarities and differences between such experiences as seeing a scarlet red and hearing a trumpet s blare or hearing a falling pin and feeling a hot poker drawing on the kantian idea that the analysis of consciousness should take as its guide formal logic peirce contends that we can construct a table of the elements of consciousness just as dmitri mendeleev constructed a table of the chemical elements by showing that the elements of consciousness fall into distinct classes peirce makes significant headway in developing the very sort of objective phenomenology which vindicates the studious blind man locke so derides charles s peirce s phenomenology shows how his phenomenology rests on his logic gives an account of peirce s phenomenology as science and then shows how his work can be used to develop an objective phenomenological vocabulary ultimately richard kenneth atkins shows how peirce s pioneering and distinctive formal logic led him to a phenomenology that addresses many of the questions philosophers of mind continue to raise today

the blood and ill deeds many had left behind forty five years later they would take an accounting some would call them cowards who high tailed it they would offer to drain two manmade lakes slowly there was meeliah an island girl left along while clay albert tended to the lives of a rich philadelphia family and she knew how to bake a pineapple sweet potato pie that could arouse and her jungle sting was severe her punishment would be unending clay albert was determined to break her one day they could not coax her out of the lake one sunday three brides to be would go off in a huff looking for adventure a thing called hatching they came upon a black family their intent was to enjoy some freshly churned ice cream and place ribbons in the pretty little girls hair but three days later one of the teenage boys would be bludgeoned to death was it something they did said or wrote would barbara lynn a bride to be get to live in the cottage behind the plantation house where slave graves were recently discovered did tim really love her or was he after her blood line hed proclaimed there are no brown spots about me i am white from tick to tock and my eyes really while one community dismantled and escaped into the forest another one a state away vowed to leave a forest in dorchester county south carolina beat their tools into cleats and create the greatest civilization of modern times one that would one day leave the gravity of the earth and float among the stars they had promised their mother a homeland but first they would tenderly assault unjust social and political structures some pressed into their minds that it would take 100 years but more than one retorted were going to do it in one generation the year is 2012 and counting to 2033 from 1933 a 100 years although thelma claimed to be the mother of more children than any woman known hardly six could be counted at any one time they having gone on to the other side she said shed referred to them as her glories her carrots were they fathom with little to go on but the suspicious tone of a business attorney and some missing birth certificates the author recreates this lost civilization in the dark circle the search for the lost children of the mud the tenderness and love between miles and thelma dunston are captured as the the slave girl and the jew five overlapping stories tell of their courage and toils of rebirth of these families and the triumph of the human spirit
