the romance of the rose has been a controversial text since it was written in the thirteenth century there is evidence for radically different readings as as early as the first half of the fourteenth century the text provided inspiration for both courtly and didactic poets some read it as a celebration of human love others as an erudite philosophical work still others as a satirical representation of social and sexual follies on one hand it was praised as an edifying treatise on the other condemned as lascivious and misogynistic kevin brownlee and sylvia huot and the contributors to this volume pierre yves badel emmanuele baumgartner john v fleming robert pogue harrison david f hult stephen g nichols lee patterson daniel poirion karl d uitti dieuwke e van der poel and lori walters represent all the major areas of current work on the romance of the rose both in american and in europe the volume will be of value to students and scholars of medieval literature intellectual history and art history

this fresh and accessible ethnography offers a new vision of how society might cohere in the face of on going global displacement dislocation and migration drawing from intensive fieldwork in a highly diverse north london neighborhood daniel miller and sophie woodward focus on an everyday item blue jeans to learn what one simple article of clothing can tell us about our individual and social lives and challenging by extension the foundational anthropological presumption of the normative miller and woodward argue that blue jeans do not always represent social and cultural difference from gender and wealth to style and circumstance instead they find that jeans allow individuals to inhabit what the authors term the ordinary miller and woodward demonstrate that the emphasis on becoming ordinary is important for immigrants and the population of north london more generally and they call into question foundational principles behind anthropology sociology and philosophy

evokes the blood and mud and terror of combat a good primer of the battle of poitiers with prose that is by turns professional and passionate de re militari on september 13 1356 near poitiers in western france the small english army of edward the black prince crushed the forces of the french king jean ii in one of the most famous battles of the hundred years war over the centuries the story of this against the odds english victory has along with crcy and agincourt become part of the legend of medieval warfare and yet in recent times this classic battle has received less attention than the other celebrated battles of the period the time is ripe for a reassessment and this is the aim of christian teutsch s thought provoking new account teutsch describes in vivid detail the black prince s experiences that led to his horse charge across the countryside of southwest france and the critical actions of romorantin and chatellerault that made poitiers possible his narrative culminates with the prince s daring ride to draw the french king jean into battle and the drama of the combat itself combined with a selection of over 15 battlefield maps showing the orders of battle this informative and highly readable account is a compulsive purchase for all with an interest in medieval history the lance and longbow society

dale dorsey considers one of the most important questions in philosophical ethics to what extent do the demands of morality have authority over us and our lives he defends a position that runs counter to the traditional view and argues that we are not required to conform to moral demands furthermore doing so can be quite literally wrong

in the high middle ages the dream narrative was an enormously popular and influential form along with the romance it was perhaps the genre of the age it has come down to us in such classics twelfth to fourteenth century classics as the divine comedy the romance of the rose piers plowman chaucer s early poetry and the works of guillaume de machaut this book redefines the dream vision by attending to its role in philosophical debate of the time a conservative role in defense of the high medieval synthesis of reason and revelation lynch shows how the epistemological basis of this synthesis and the theories of visions that emerged from it drew on arabic commentaries of aristotle these theories informed poetic visions modeled on boethius s consolation of philosophy a work she discusses in detail before turning to alain de lille jean de meun and dante a final section on john gower s confessio amantis shows how fourteenth and fifteenth century writers extended and finally moved beyond the conventional form of the dream vision

this magisterial book is an analysis of the course of western intellectual history between a d 400 and 1400 the book is arranged in two parts the first surveys the comparative modes of thought and varying success of byzantine latin christian and muslim cultures and the second takes the reader from the eleventh century revival of learning to the high middle ages and beyond the period in which the vibrancy of western intellectual culture enabled it to stamp its imprint well beyond the frontiers of christendom marcia colish argues that the foundations of the western intellectual tradition were laid in the middle ages and not as is commonly held in the judeo christian or classical periods she contends that western medieval thinkers produced a set of tolerances tastes concerns and sensibilities that made the middle ages unlike other chapters of the western intellectual experience she provides astute descriptions of the vernacular and oral culture of each country of europe explores the nature of medieval culture and its transmission profiles seminal thinkers augustine anselm gregory the great aquinas ockham studies heresy from manichaeism to huss and wycliffe and investigates the influence of arab and jewish writing on scholasticism and the resurrection of greek studies colish concludes with an assessment of the modes of medieval thought that ended with the period and those that remained as bases for later ages of european intellectual history

to the phenomenological life engagements so vigorously advocated by husserl to the life significant issues phenomenology addresses and to how it has enriched the human sciences lastly the phenomenological project's new horizons on the plane of life are limned horizons with so powerful a draw that they may be said not to beckon but to summon here is the movement's vanguard this collection has 71 entries each entry is followed by a relevant bibliography there is a helpful glossary of terms and an index of names
