the reader s guide to music is designed to provide a useful single volume guide to the ever increasing number of english language book length studies in music each entry consists of a bibliography of some 3 20 titles and an essay in which these titles are evaluated by an expert in the field in light of the history of writing and scholarship on the given topic the more than 500 entries include not just writings on major composers in music history but also the genres in which they worked from early chant to rock and roll and topics important to the various disciplines of music scholarship from aesthetics to gay lesbian musicology

Besides a collage which highlights the aesthetic effects resulting from the networking, overlapping, and mixing of forms, another strand of the book looks at the political and social dimensions of design: how are design objects material modes of a critical inquiry on movements of people and things? What role do object trajectories play in the émigré movements of the 1930s and 1940s? Other texts follow the question of how migrants and refugees form their experience and political fight for acceptance into design and architectural productions. A final essay contributes to wordings and projections: what vocabulary do we need in order to adequately think and write about a design dispersed?

the past two decades have witnessed a proliferation of scholarship on dress in the ancient world these recent studies have established the extent to which greece and rome were vestimentary cultures and they have demonstrated the critical role dress played in communicating individuals identities status and authority despite this emerging interest in ancient dress little work has been done to understand religious aspects and uses of dress this volume aims to fill this gap by examining a diverse range of religious sources including literature art performance coinage economic markets and memories
